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



CAGNES-SUR-MER

Ideally located between Nice and Cannes, the city draws its charm from the Mediaeval village of Haut-de-Cagnes whose Château-Musée Grimaldi dominates the city and where many artists and personalities, including Renoir, have stayed. Thanks, in particular, to the 'Polygone Riviera' first French outdoor shopping centre, Cagnes has also become a popular shopping destination, with a rich calendar of events including horseracing at Hippodrome de la Côte d'Azur.

Cros-de-Cagnes picturesque little fishing port, Haut-de-Cagnes Mediaeval village and its Grimaldi castle-museum, Renoir museum, the contemporary jewelry museum, The Côte d'Azur hippodrome...

The Villa les Camélias museum, the Belle Époque villas, the magnificent panorama from the Tête de Chien paths, the gardens and the beaches...



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Nice, its city centre included on the UNESCO World Heritage list under the title «Nice, Riviera winter resort city».

On 27 July 2021, UNESCO recognised the Outstanding Universal Value of Nice's architectural, landscape and urban heritage, and in particular of the vast 522-hectare urban ensemble, an eminent example of the fusion of international cultural influences, shaped from the middle of the 18th century to the middle of the 20th century by the cosmopolitan winter resort.

This ensemble is comprised of regulated urban planning, green spaces planted with exotic species, promenades, including the emblematic Promenade des Anglais, and a resort heritage that reflects contributions from all over the world, with its villas, hotels, palaces, and recreational buildings, as well as its places of worship and sociability.

ÈZE

Èze stretches on all three Corniche roads. At the top, the Grande Corniche runs through La Revère Nature Park. Below, on the Basse Corniche, Èze Bord-de-Mer is a small seaside resort with BelleÉpoque villas. Between them, on the Moyenne Corniche, perched on a rocky promontory, the Mediaeval village is the main tourist attraction with shops, craftsmen, hotels and gourmet restaurants (with Michelin stars). At its highest point, an exotic garden in the Mediaeval castle ruins offers a breath-taking panorama all the way to Saint-Tropez.

SIGHTS

Mediaeval village perched high above the Mediterranean Sea; perfumeries; Baroque church with altarpieces and trompel'oeil paintings; exotic garden.

SAINT-JEAN-CAP-FERRAT

'Calm, luxury and voluptuousness': these words ideally describe this cape near Nice and Villefranche-sur-Mer. The old fishing village became a holiday haven in the early 20th century, with the arrival of wealthy foreign families, who built vast estates, like Villa Ephrussi de Rothschild. Many artists chose to stay there: Jean Cocteau decorated Villa Santo Sospir. An 8km coastal footpath offers exceptional panoramas. Beaches and creeks are an invitation to relax, while a wide range of water sports make it ideal for sportier stays.

SIGHTS

The port; Saint-Hospice chapel (11th c.) with a giant bronze statue of the Virgin Mary; Villa Ephrussi de Rothschild and its theme gardens; Musée des Coquillages; Villa Santo Sospir.

SAINT-LAURENT-DU-VAR

Saint-Laurent-du-Var offers visitors the charm of an authentic village and the excitement of a listed Tourist Resort (Station classée de tourisme), resolutely turned towards the Mediterranean Sea and its fun. From Esplanade les Goélands to Promenade des Flots Bleus and all the way to the yachting harbour, strollers can take advantage of a coastal walkway reserved for pedestrians and lined with restaurants, pubs and clubs, day and night. With 2km of public and private beaches, Saint-Laurent-du-Var provides many opportunities for water sports and beach sports.

SIGHTS

The Old Town, Romanesque church (11th c.).
Citrus groves and horticulture also have their place in local history.

VILLEFRANCHE-SUR-MER

A maritime town on a privileged site, Villefranche-sur-Mer is one of the main ports on the Côte d'Azur, a major stopover for cruise ships. Its picturesque little fishing port is also home to a flotilla of yachts and pointus (traditional fishing boats). With the majestic curve of its shoreline, its 16th-century Citadel and colourful façades, Villefranche-sur-Mer also became a favourite venue for painters and artists.

SIGHTS

The Bay; 16th century Citadel with the Volti Museum; the port with brightly coloured façades; Saint-Pierre chapel decorated by Jean Cocteau; Saint-Michel church; Old Town; Rue Obscure (a long vaulted passageway) the Goetz-Boumeester museum.

MID-COUNTRY

Not far from the shores of the Mediterranean, this area offers a haven of calm, freshness and serenity. The villages, nestled in lush greenery or clinging to the cliff like eagle nests, invite the visitor to stroll through their charming streets. He will discover a preserved heritage: old oil mills, facades, fountains, wash houses, and, at the turn of a chapel ... a panoramic view of the valleys, the sea or the mountains.

This unique setting, bathed in sunshine that exalts the colors, has seduced the greatest artists ... Following in their footsteps, in search of the works left in inheritance, will enchant art lovers.

The surrounding countryside is the true paradise for sportsmen who will take hiking or biking trails, or cool off in the gorges for a canyoning descent.

ASPREMONT

The perched village of Aspremont overlooks the Plaine du Var. Its houses are arranged in concentric circles around its fine Gothic church. An invigorating climb to visit the village brings its rewards: narrow paved streets, vaulted passageways, secret flower gardens, stone houses, fountains and wash houses, etc. And there is a splendid panorama on the Lower Var Valley.

SIGHTS

Saint-Jacques-le-Majeur church: 13th and 16th century paintings and murals; altarpiece (18th c.), naïve statue of the Virgin Mary; Saint-Claude votive chapel (17th c.) built to ward off the Plague; Notre-Dame-des-Salettes chapel.

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BONSON

Clinging to a promontory on Mont-Vial overlooking the Var and Estéron valleys, Bonson stands 480m above sea level. A perched village typical of the hinterland of Nice, it stretches along a ridge, which offers vertiginous vistas, and has preserved part of its Mediaeval architectural heritage. The South-facing slope is covered with olive trees growing on agricultural terraces

SIGHTS

The church of St-Benoît (1494) which houses an altarpiece by Antoine Bréa, the chapel of St Hospice, the chapel of Passet, the chapels of St-Antoine and St-Jean Baptiste (below the village).

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CARROS

Perched 400m above sea level, the village, a listed Picturesque Site in the Alpes-Maritimes département, is huddled around its 12th century castle and has preserved its traditional Mediaeval architecture. Its privileged position offers visitors a grand panorama over the entire Lower Var Valley (Plaine du Var) from the Sea to the Alpine peaks. As a holiday destination or for a short stopover, Carros provides calm and authenticity and a pristine natural setting. Today, the Castle houses an International Contemporary Art Centre.

SIGHTS

The Castle of Carros (a listed Artistic Natural Site and Monument); many remains: Ancient, Mediaeval and Modern (11th-18th c.) and Contemporary (19th-20th c.), «the site of the «Roche Fendue».

MID-COUNTRY



CASTAGNIERS

Castagniers, a lovely recent perched village in the hills amid generous Mediterranean vegetation, offers a splendid open view on the Lower Var Valley (Plaine du Var). Founded ca. 1870, the village is dominated by Mont-Cima, towering 879m above sea level, and offering a grandiose view

SIGHTS

Oil mill (still active); Saint-Michel parish church (19th c.); Notre-Dame-de-la-Paix Abbey, a convent of Cistercian nuns and its lovely garden (1928); chocolate factory; Croix de Cuivre; Vallon Obscur du Donaréo, a protected listed Natura 2000 site

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CHÂTEAUNEUF-VILLEVIEILLE

The present village is situated below the old medieval village, on the road to the Châteauneuf pass. From the small square where a church stands, quiet alleys wind their way. A small road leads up to the beautiful ruins of the old medieval village of Châteauneuf-Villevieille, whose fortified remains date back to the 9th - 12th centuries.

SIGHTS

Church of Sainte-Marie de Villevieille. Ruins of the old Chateauneuf. Chapel of Saint-Joseph. Castle of Remaurian with its chapel.

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COLOMARS

Composed of several hamlets — Les Cabanes, La Madone, La Sirole on the heights; La Manda in the Lower Var Valley — Colomars is a small recent residential village built on a ridge overlooking the Plaine du Var. The commune is known as the land of olive trees, the famous caillitiers du Pays Niçois, which produces olives appreciated for their lemony anise flavour and oil renowned among true gourmets.

SIGHTS

Notre Dame-de-la-Nativité church (19th c.); Saint-Roch chapel at La Sirole (1857); little valleys with botanical and geological features; cascades and aqueducts to bring water to old oil mills

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DRAP

Ideally situated at the entrance to the Paillon Valley and a few kilometres from the Mediterranean coast, the commune of Drap is worth a visit. The charm of the banks of the Paillon, the Provençal facades, the 18th century bell tower and the village square will be revealed to the visitor. The town has a wealth of heritage for the curious, a live performance space and a cultural centre devoted to exhibitions for culture lovers, and offers a wide choice of entertainment all year round.

SIGHTS

St. John the Baptist Church. Chapel of Saint-Catherine of Alexandria. The chapel of the white penitents. Saint Thecle, historical canal. The Tercier Plateau. The Genoese oil mill. Cultural centre of Les Gras. Espace Jean Ferrat.

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MID-COUNTRY



DURANUS

Reached along a surprising mountain road, Duranus is built directly on limestone formations overlooking the Vésubie Valley, with houses scattered on the slopes in the heart of pristine nature with oak and olive trees. It is also surrounded by small valleys harbouring exceptional biological reserves, cascades and aqueducts. At the exit of the village, dominate the place called «le Saut des Français», to admire the valley of the Vésubie!

SIGHTS

Ruins of the site of Roccasparvièra (original village, 12th c.); Sainte-Eurosie and Saint-Michel chapels; Le Saut des Français (belvedere); old arsenic mine; Notre-Dame-de-la-Nativité church (19th c.).

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FALICON

Surrounded by terraced slopes with olive and fig trees, this Mediaeval village has preserved all the charm of the perched villages of yore. Behind its rampart wall, with fortified gates, narrow winding streets and paved little squares, Falicon also offers splendid vistas.

SIGHTS

Notre-Dame-de-la-Nativité church (1624) with a square bell tower with a pyramidal roof; Sainte-Croix chapel (1619); Saint-François gate (1876); old well; small fort (18th c.); La Bastide, former residence of the Tonduti family (16th c.)

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GATTIÈRES

Under the Baous mountains amid splendid landscapes, the old perched village of Gattières offers lovely Mediaeval streets, little flower-decked squares and fine fountains, as well as arts and crafts shops: silk painting, sculpture, woodworking and wrought iron. The commune extends down to the Plaine du Var, with market gardens, horticultural plantations and orchards.

SIGHTS

Saint-Nicolas church (18th c.); Notre-Dame-du-Var chapel (15th c.)

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GILETTE

The village of Gilette is perched 400m above sea level overlooking the confluence of the Var and Estéron Rivers. The narrow streets lead to the castle ruins and a unique panorama over the valleys and mountains. Its stepped streets, vaulted passageways and pleasant little squares enhance the character of the village. Amid pristine untamed natural areas, Gilette treasures its authenticity and tradition. Olive trees remain its main source of wealth.

SIGHTS

Saint-Pierre-et-de-l'Assomption church (17th c.); Saint-Pancrace chapel; wash houses and fountains; oil mill, the museum of ancient crafts «Lou Ferouil».

MID-COUNTRY



LA GAUDE

Under the Baous mountains, La Gaude is a pleasant residential village brimming with Provençal charm. It enchanted Provençal writer Marcel Pagnol, who lived there for 30 years. The village stretches on a ridge, with its carefully renovated houses and paved narrow streets. Every year in November, the commune organises the 'Jazz sous les Bigaradiers' Festival with international and local artists. On the Plaine du Var, La Baronne district forms a vast IT, agronomic and horticultural research centre.

SIGHTS

Sainte-Victoire church, White Penitents' chapel Saint-Ange, Saint-Michel shrine, The Provence Ecomuseum Ib Schmedes.

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LA ROQUETTE-SUR-VAR

Perched atop a peak in a superb mountain setting, the village of La Roquette-sur-Var offers a vast panorama from the sea to the highest peaks in the Mercantour Park. Along with its picturesque little streets, fountains and wash house, the village has preserved many traces of the past. The ruins of Castel-Vieil attest to Roman and Mediaeval occupation. On the main square, the traditional game of pétanque adds to the convivial atmosphere of La Roquette-sur-Var.

SIGHTS

Saint-Pierre Baroque church; Castel-Vieil ruins; Notre-Dame del Bosc chapel (15th c.).

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LE BROC

Perched on a promontory overlooking the confluence of the Var and Estéron valleys, Le Broc is dominated by Montagne du Chiers. The village offers its charming narrow streets lined with old stone houses grouped around a picturesque arcaded square. Many vestiges of the past illustrate Le Broc's rich cultural heritage. Near the former castle, there is a splendid panorama over the Alps.

SIGHTS

Sainte-Marie-Madeleine church (1563); Sainte-Marguerite and Saint-Sébastien chapels; oil mill.

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LA TRINITÉ

Built along the Paillon valley, this small town is located just a few kilometres from Nice. Nearby, Notre-Dame de Laghet is the most remarkable monument in its territory, built in the 17th century following several miracles reported in the vicinity. Today, it is one of the most popular sanctuaries in France, drawing pilgrims from all countries.

SIGHTS

Sainte-Trinité parish church (listed Historic Monument); Saint-Grat church (1848, Italian Baroque); Notre-Dame de Laghet and its museum of ex-votos (one of the largest collections of votive offerings in Provence); Astrorama.

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MID-COUNTRY



LEVENS

An old fortified Mediaeval village perched on a rocky spur 600m above sea level, Levens can be visited by following the sloping streets lined with houses built in local stone, under porches and covered passageways.

Near the village, the Grand Pré de Levens, is a large open meadow, a privileged place for relaxation with its 13 hectares of greenery: events are scheduled there year round, including Fête du Cheval (a horse show) in July.

SIGHTS

Old gates in the rampart; Napoleonic Marshal André Masséna's house; birthplace of 19th-century political figure François Malausséna, first French mayor of Nice; Galerie du Portal for exhibitions; Saint-Antonin church; Black and White Penitents' chapels.

SAINT-ANDRÉ-DE-LA-ROCHE

Saint-André is a small town adjoining Nice. Its territory extends to the neighbouring hills of Rimiez and L'Abadie. It is made up of several discreet hamlets nestled in the woods. The Banquière River, a tributary of the Paillon which flows into Baie des Anges, runs through the main centre. There is a project for reopening its once-famous natural grotto. Saint-André-de-la-Roche is nicknamed 'Lou pais dei babi' ('land of toads', in the local Nissart language) and the call of frogs can be heard on summer evenings.

SIGHTS

Oil mills; Saint-André and Saint-Grat chapels; the grotto; Thaon de Revel castle (17th c.) on a promontory overlooking the village.

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SAINT-BLAISE

The road winds its way through delicate silvery landscapes: Saint-Blaise is like a shiny medal in a leafy setting. The village offers fine colourful houses huddled around the church and a bell tower with a red-tile roof. Adjacent, the old Guibert house (18th century) - restored and converted into a communal inn known as the Prieuré. Its oil mill (18th century) now houses the workshop of a young potter who offers her work to visitors. The commune is dominated by the old village and the ruins of a medieval castle (13th c.), which offer hikers beautiful views of the valley.

SIGHTS

Well-preserved castle ruins (13th c.); its 18th-century church and the attached priory; the 18th-century oil mill; The bridge; works by the artist Jean-Pierre Augier in the village and in the Gallery-Museum, the centuries-old olive groves.

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SAINT-JEANNET

Nestled at the foot of an immense cliff, the Baou of Saint-Jeannet, which dominates the entire territory, the charming village of the same name is Mediaeval in origin. With its houses huddled closely together to form a rampart wall around the church. A genuine paradise for rock climbers, it offers many routes starting from the village.

SIGHTS

Hiking trails leading to Le Castellet with the ruins of the castle and keep, Castellaras and the dry-stone pastoral heritage; Saint-Jean-Baptiste church (1666) and four chapels in the village; two vineyards.

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MID-COUNTRY



SAINT-MARTIN-DU-VAR

Located at the confluence of the valleys Var, Estéron, Vésubie and Tinée, Saint-Martin-du-Var became a separate commune quite recently, built on land obtained by damming up the east bank of the Var River, starting in the mid-19th century. Today, it is a fastgrowing commune. The walks on the heights of the village, offer magnificent views of the confluence of the Var and the Estéron

SIGHTS

The old village, the two big squares (18th and 19th c.), St-Roch church (paintings 17th c.), Notre-Dame del Bosc chapel (Romanesque style).

TOURRETTE-LEVENS

In the perched village of Tourrette-Levens, there prevails a striking Mediaeval atmosphere thanks to fine houses and the ramparts built of splendid white stone, as well as the last remaining tower of the old castle, once one of the finest in the region. The village offers an exceptional panorama towards the sea and mountains.

SIGHTS

Notre-Dame-de-l'Assomption Church; square and White Penitents' chapel; in the Castle: Museum of Natural History, Museum of Traditional Trades, Museum of Prehistory.

Perched on a ridge at the confluence of the Var and Vésubie rivers at the top of a steep slope with olive trees, Utelle offers a fine Mediaeval complex. 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VENCE

At the foot of the Alpine Arc and its "baous", Vence offers all the authentic charm of its historic city and natural setting. Many hiking, biking and bridle trails help discover this pristine nature.

The smallest cathedral in France Notre-Dame-de-la-Nativité (11th c.); Chapelle du Rosaire decorated by Matisse (1951); the museum in the Castle of Villeneuve: a major centre of modern and contemporary art; Gombrowicz museum in the Villa Alexandrin.



Its alpine ski area, the largest in the region (135km of ski slopes), combines both fun and skill. Throughout the winter, the resort offers entertainment for both children and adults.

Its 30km of slopes delights children and adults, from beginners to experienced skiers. Space for children, toboggan run, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing, not to mention its giant Zipline.

BELVÉDÈRE

A perched village in the Vésubie Valley, Belvédère is a 'must' for mountaineers heading for the famous Gordolasque Valley. The heart of the village has lost none of its old-fashioned charm: narrow streets, little squares, tall alpine Piedmontese-style houses, covered passageways or old portals, etc. The activities practised in the past thanks to the abundance of water from springs and torrents are still visible: fountains, wash houses, mills and smithy. The village is the starting point for many hiking trails in the surrounding valleys and the Mercantour National Park.

It is built in tiers, with a splendid covered wash house with columns, superb stone façades, a Baroque chapel painted bright yellow, a Mediaeval arcaded covered passageway and a little square with a panoramic terrace, etc. At the highest point in the village, an orientation table identifies all the main peaks in the Alpes-Maritimes département.

Just 15km from the village, the ski resort of Isola 2000, built in the early 1970s, offers a skiing area of 120km as well as many summer activities: fishing, miniature golf, swimming pool, hiking, mountain bike etc...The resort is open all year for a holiday full of emotion.

LA BOLLÈNE-VÉSUBIE

On the Route des Grandes Alpes, which reaches the Bévéra Valley over Col de Turini, La Bollène-Vésubie is a very old village built on the slope of a mountain promontory. With its splendid oval layout girdled by the road, it is made up narrow stepped streets lined with tall alpine houses huddled closely together, some built directly on the bedrock. This mountain territory features barns and vacheries (cow sheds), valleys, gorges and the Turini-Camp d'Argent ski resort.

Built on a ridge overlooking the Tinée Valley, surrounded by peaks and wooded slopes, La Tour-sur-Tinée boasts a superb panorama and natural setting. The village has preserved its Mediaeval configuration with paved streets and square lined with painted façades. From the village of La Tour, hiking paths of different levels of difficulty take trekkers on loop trails or to other neighbouring villages.

It offers an over-180° panorama on the valley from Mont-Vial all the way to the Upper Tinée Valley.

Dubbed La Suisse Niçoise ('Nice's Little Switzerland'), this Mediaeval village also features various fine mansions (late 18th/early 19th c.). The trails leading to surrounding pine and larch forest are lined with different chalets. The village provides access to many activities to discover the mountains in a remarkable setting, abounding in an incomparable wealth of plant and animal species.

SAINT-SAUVEUR-SUR-TINÉE

Huddled on a loop in the Tinée River, Saint-Sauveur-sur-Tinée offers an enchanting atmosphere: steep narrow streets, lovely round fountain, large covered wash house and, further on, a Baroque church with a painted façade and tall Romanesque church tower (15th c.), as well as carved stone lintels (16th c.), an old bread oven and an flour mill.

Tournefort was rebuilt with dispersed houses after the village was destroyed by the earthquake of 1887. The old village can easily be reached by a trail with broad steps; the ruins of the castle overrun by vegetation are easily accessible thanks to special trails.

La Colmiane offers many activities for families: summer toboggan, tree climbing, miniature golf, riding school, paragliding, trampoline, farm visits, hiking with pack donkeys, swimming pool, mountain bike, rock climbing, and via ferrata, as well as 30 kilometres of ski runs in winter.
